IMG Academy alum and Duke graduate Andy Borman heads the IMG Basketball Academy. Borman was a four-year letterman for the Duke men's basketball team that won an NCAA championship in 2001, and a three-year starter for the men's soccer team.

Most recently, Andy served as the founder and director of *The Athlete Within* Basketball School and Illinois Old School AAU Program. Previously, Andy was the Director of Basketball Operations at San Jose State University and the Director of Player Development at University of California at Berkeley. Borman is also the nephew of Duke University men's basketball coach, Mike Krzyzewski.

In the past year alone, the IMG Basketball Academy has helped develop prep players like Kyril Natyazhko (freshman at the University of Arizona), Dwight Powell (committed to Stanford) and worked with college and NBA players like Earl Clark (No. 14 pick in NBA Draft), Jrue Holiday (No. 17 pick), Kevin Martin (20.6 points per game in 2010) and more. Others who have trained at the IMG Basketball Academy include Chauncey Billups, Kobe Bryant, Vince Carter, Sasha Vujacic, Joakim Noah and others.
