

Scott Bowers

Scott Bowers is in his fourth year as Director of Goalkeeping of the IMG Soccer Academy. He is also the assistant coach of the Bradenton Academics PDL soccer team, which plays during the summer and consists of college players.

Prior to joining IMG Academies, Bowers coached both men and women in Division I, II and III. He began his career at Salisbury University, where he helped the women's program reach the NCAA Tournament and garner a 21-1-2 record. He then went on to coach at the University of Tampa in 2001, where the men's program went undefeated and won the NCAA National Championship.

Scott moved onto West Virginia University the following year. He assisted in all facets of the Men's Soccer program including recruiting, training, budgeting, scouting, fund raising and academic advising. Scott played a crucial role in the development of three MLS goalkeepers including Nick Noble (Chicago Fire), Aaron Pichkolan (FC Dallas) and Devon McTavish (DC United.) In 2004, Bowers assisted WVU in a 12-7-1 record. The team knocked off two ranked opponents, St. John's and Notre Dame, and made it to the Big East Conference semi-finals.
